Eyes Cleanse with 2% boric acid solution. Use separate piece of cotton for each eye.

Face Bathe with plain water.

Head & Ears Wash with soap and water, dry well.

Nose Gently cleanse with an oiled applicator only as needed.

Mouth Do not cleanse mouth, and put only clean things into the baby's mouth (clean nipples of mother, sterile nipples for bottles)

Cord Keep dry. Use sterile dressing for the cord. Change dressing if damp at any time or soiled. *(Mercuriochrome)*

Body Sponge bath until cord has fallen and umbilicus is healed.

Circumcision Watch for bleeding or swelling. Change dressing each time it is soiled. Use sterile vaseline on dressing. Do not give tub bath until circumcision is healed.

Bowels Must have one or two good stools each day. If not, give flush of warm soapy water, (using small bulb syringe). Apply vaseline or oil before inserting. Watch for constipation and give a flush. If bowels are loose and frequent, get in touch with your doctor. Watch for irritation and redness around rectum. Do not take baby up to change diaper if he is sleeping.

Feeding-
Preast at 6 - 9 - 12 - 3 - 6 - 10 - 2

Water Water that has been boiled is given two or three times a day not closer than one hour before feeding time.

Bottles &
Nipples Always have two nipples (alternate the use). Cleanse and boil each time they are used and keep sterile.

Mother's
Nipples Cleanse each time baby nurses with a 2% boric acid solution.

Boric Acid
Solution 1 teaspoon boric acid powder
 8 ounces (one glass of water) that has been boiled.
 Boil container, pour solution in and keep closed. It may be obtained from a drug store already prepared.
